*Calentamiento* is a project born during a artistic residency in the summer of 2021 in Sicily. A wildfire in a protected coastal area and in a bathhouse, together with the beach life going on as usual just next to them, with cocktails and summer hits playing, are the incipit of the project. *Calentamiento* is foremost a reggaeton song, whose lyrics are entirely made of excerpts from the Spanish version of the Glasgow Climate Pact. What may seem like a summer hit is instead a song that talks about climate change, but through empty and disconnected sentences. A substantially meaningless song, which alludes to the inconsistency of these international treaties, unable to bind countries to real commitments. Alternating music and fire sounds, the song invades the exhibition space, already filled with smoke that reminds the viewer of both fires and clubs. In an almost burned out kiosk cocktails are served with a ice cubes containing small images of fires.

A funerary stone rests on a lawn that invades the closed space and which is destined to wither. On the funerary stone, instead of the name of the deceased and of the dates of birth and death, the word *Ongoing* is engraved, an expression that indicates something still in progress, continuing, current, growing. A term frequently used in the artistic field to describe works and projects still in the process of development and expansion. The work is a response to the feeling of having to always be active, participatory, present, and the sense of exhaustion that often derives from it. Even when dead, should we continue to be productive? However, the word in itself also suggest that there is still time to change things, that nothing is set in stone.

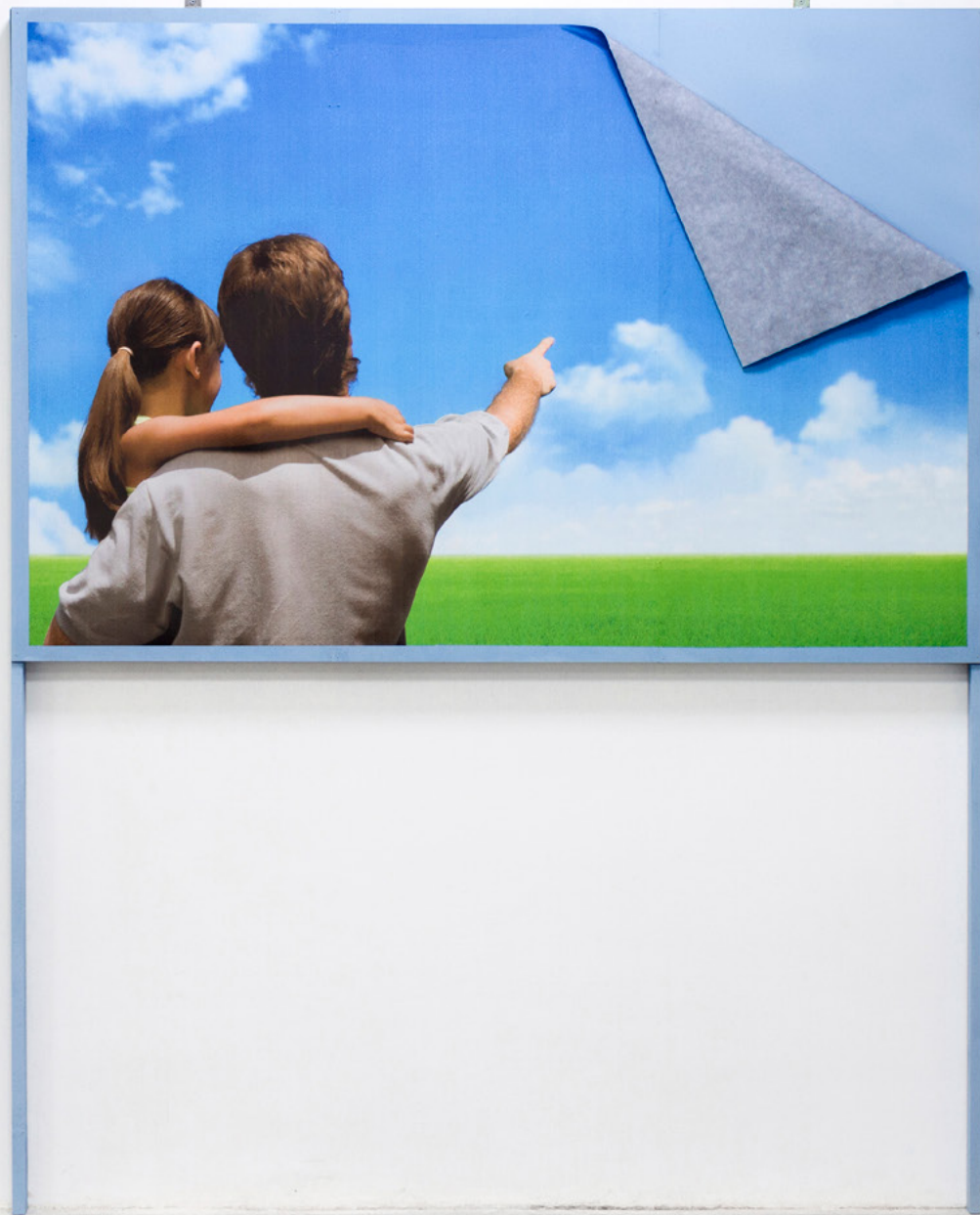

*Cascasse il cielo* is an extensive project collecting different works. In various ways, they all embody the disillusion in regards to our present and future, the detachment between the representation that is often given of reality and how we actually perceive it, and the contradictions between the economic system on which we rely and the effects of a climate crisis that seems to leave no way out.

The fall of trees on parked cars is becoming a recurrent phenomenon in our cities, and can be seen as an ironic epitome of nature's revenge on machines. A different kind of nature, as beautiful as it is fake, is the one used in advertisign to promise us a future full of good things. But the collapse of this lie is the only future we can expect, and the probabilities of avoing it are getting thinner.

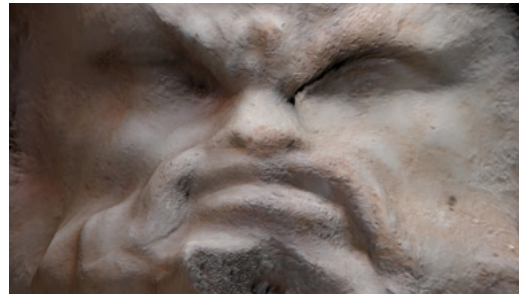
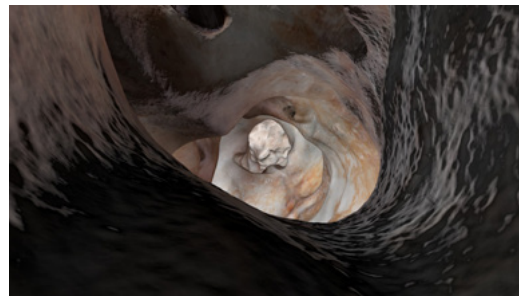
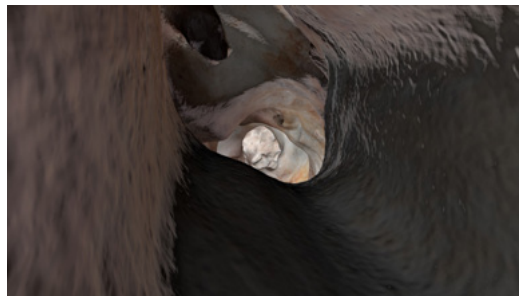
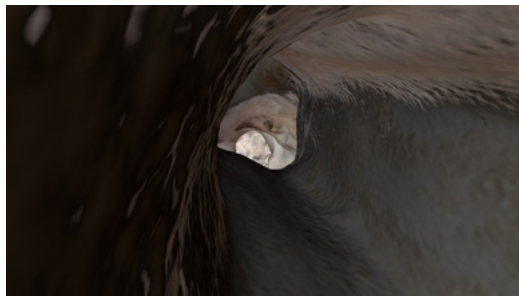
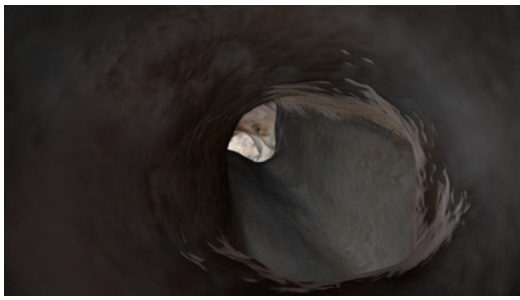


Inscribed in a series of works delving into the theme of exhaustion, *20 Minute Full Body Burnout at Home | No Equipment* closely mimics home workouts videos largely widespread on the internet. Despite their apparent simplicity, these tutorials embody several facets of the neoliberal system of values. Lurking behind the promises of healthiness and fulfillment, lies the aestheticization of the ceaseless, alienating repetition of labor, and the enforcement of the hyper-productive, overworking mentality. Moreover, home workouts are meant for those who either don't have the money to afford going to a gym, don't have enough free time to do it, or don't feel like going outside of their home.

In the video, following their instructor, the two artists start by engaging in a series of exercises but almost immediately lay on the ground and begin sleeping for almost twenty minutes straight.

Drawing inspiration from Greek mythology as a pre-scientific tool of knowledge and investigation, the video installation *Gänzlich Unerreichbar* (Totally Unreachable) is focused on the mystery inherent in the processes of deep learning and machine learning, and the impossibility of observing the internal processes of an AI at work (black box), but only their results. The artwork is part of a larger series of works focused on the use of technology, internet and AI as a source of knowledge, and on the way we exchange and elaborate data between men and machines. The series *Feed* is the second chapter of the work. Here, paintings depicting the torture of Prometheus are recombined within themselves to create a new iconography, suggesting the ambivalences of our complex relationship with the internet.

*How to make jam* is the result of a year-long commission by the G. A. Levis Museum, in which artists are invited to open a dialogue with the work and paintings of G. A. Levis, through the medium of photography. In *How to make jam*, instead of focusing on his art, the focus is on the mansion where Levis lived. Once sumptuous and wonderfully decorated, it is now in a state of total abandonment and decay, completely invaded by brambles even inside. This irremediable situation becomes a metaphor for the difficulties of life and the passage of time. Far from pointing to grand and unrealistic solutions, the aim of the work is to suggest that there may be alternative postures and strategies for tackling such large problems. There's not much that can be done, but one can sometime try to make something simple, something sweet. The blackberries were collected from the brambles that infested the house, and were used not only to make some jam, but, through the antotype technique, they were also used as the only ingredient for printing the photographs taken in the villa.

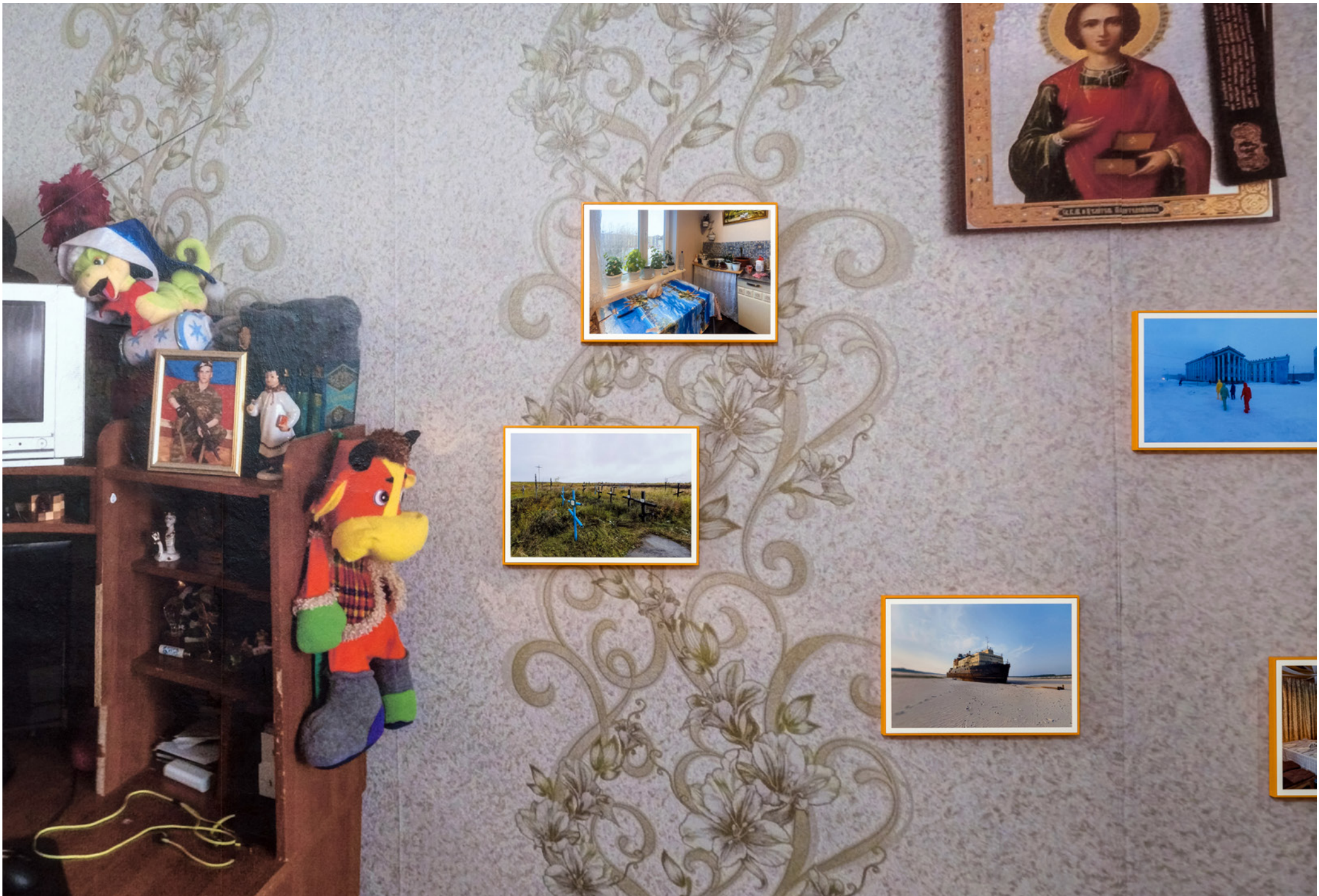

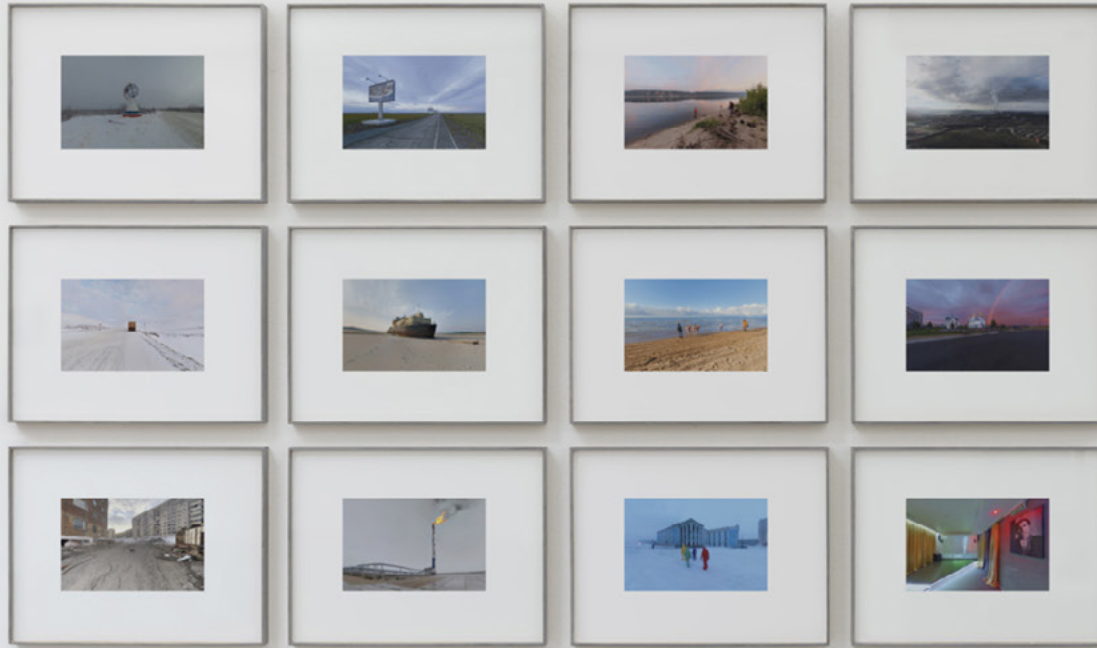

Shaped as a visual diary, *The Long Way Home of Ivan Putnik, Truck Driver* tells the story of a Russian truck driver and his long journey to go back home. Driving across all of Siberia from east to west, through some of the most isolated lands in the world, Ivan Putnik shot hundreds of pictures, writing down notes and comments alongside his photographs. By simply documenting what happens in front of him in his everyday life, Putnik reveals some bigger threads. Not easy to unravel, they speak volume about our society at large. Presented as an archive, all the images are actually cropped screengrabs, taken from photographs made by various amateur photographers who uploaded the photospheres to Google Maps.

# Waste Programme

Waste Programme is an artistic duo born in 2017 from the encounter between Giulia Vigna (1992) and Leonardo Magrelli (1989).

Their research focuses mainly on the issues of climate change and the ways in which technology is used by the mass public. Both themes are frequently analyzed through their presence within the iconosphere.

Images, pictures and the visual field become a constant reference, explored through post-photographic and installative approaches, using practices of appropriation, re-signification, detournement and quotation, often adding to it a veil of bitter irony.
